



PARTS AND CONTROLS

The parts and controls for the VYCDVD7 and VYCDVD9 are identical, please see the diagram below and the following pages for details.



PARTS AND CONTROLS (CONTD.)

- 1. LCD screen
- 2. Stereo speakers
- 3. 2 Axis hinge
- 4. ≜ button

Push to open disc compartment cover.

NOTE:

Take care not to force cover open beyond it's design limits. Damage caused is easily identifiable and not covered under the manufacturers warranty.

- 5. Disc compartment
- 6. Multi-function button



Short press (menus): Long press (playback):

Note:

Short press functions are not available during movie playback, as indicated by the following symbol appearing on screen .

Use the remote control for full disk navigation functions.

7. Dual colour battery LED indicator

Green flashing = Charging. Green = Charged.

8. Receiver for remote control

Point remote control here.

9. Power LED indicator

LED will be illuminated RED when the DVD player is turned on.

PARTS AND CONTROLS (CONTD.)



10. Play / Pause & Enter button

Press to stop play / pause playback. Press when in a menu to confirm selection.

11. Setup button

Press to enter the Setup menu.

12. Source button

Press to select the mode, with choice of DVD or MEDIA (USB).

13. USB port

Insert USB memory stick here. For direct connection of USB flash memory sticks only. NOT for PC connection or for an external hard drive / alternative device. For further information on USB playback please see pages 19 and 20.

14. Earphone socket

Connect earphones (not supplied) here, note that connecting earphones will mute the speakers.

 To prevent possible hearing damage, do not listen at high volume levels for long periods.



- When using earphones listen at a reasonable volume for reasonable lengths of time.
- Do not turn the volume so high that you cannot hear what is around you.
- Do not use Multimedia headphones with an integrated microphone, as they will not work correctly.

15. AV Out socket

Connect the DVD player to an external device, such as a television. Contact you local VOYAGER retailer to purchase the correct AV cable.

16. On / Off switch


17. DC IN socket

Connect the supplied mains adaptor here.

GETTING STARTED

Mains adaptor

Connect the supplied mains adaptor to the socket marked 'DC IN 9-12V' on the right-hand side DVD player.



Note:

Only use the supplied mains adaptor, which is labelled: 'VOYAGER VYCDVD SERIES'

GETTING STARTED (CONTD.)

Turn the DVD player on

Slide the power switch which is located on the right-hand side of the DVD player,

to the ON position



Insert disk

Press the ≜ button to open the disk compartment, insert disk and close lid. Playback of the disk content will start automatically.





Rotate & Swivel the screen

The screen can swivel to change the viewing angle and also can then be rotated to fold flat against the main body.





Note:

The screen will only swivel in a 'clockwise' direction, to try and move the screen in an 'anti-clockwise' direction WILL result in damage being caused. Do NOT force the screen beyond the rotational limit stops. This easily identifiable damage is NOT covered under the Manufacturers Warranty.

INTERNAL BATTERY

The DVD Player incorporates an integral Lithium Polymer battery for high performance and optimum playback times. The battery has no memory effect and can be charged safely, regardless of whether the battery is fully or partially discharged.

Playback time is approximately 1.5 hours after a full charge, when used under normal operating conditions.

First Time Use

The battery should be charged for a minimum of 4 hours for the initial charge to maximize the battery life thereafter.

Battery Charging

Connect the DVD player to the supplied mains adaptor, the LED indicator will flash GREEN when the battery is charging and will turn solid GREEN once the battery has received a full charge.

The battery will charge (as required) when power is available. The DVD player can be in use whilst the battery charges.

Charge time for a fully discharged battery is approximately 2 - 3 hours.

Note:

In the event of a battery charging error, the battery charging LED indicator will 'flash'. Please verify that the correct 9.0Vdc 1Amp mains adaptor is being used (identified by the 'VOYAGER VYCDVD SERIES' sticker). Disconnect and re-connect the mains adaptor until the fault clears. If the fault does not clear, then contact your dealer for repair.

It is recommended that the internal battery is recharged fully every 4months, in order to prevent deep battery discharge and possible damage.

Failure to do so may result in the battery failing to hold a charge and will not be considered manufacturing defect and therefore not covered under the Manufacturers Warranty.

Battery Replacement

The internal battery is not user replaceable, once it no longer holds its charge (approx. 300 charging cycles) please contact your VOYAGER Authorised Service Centre, for a replacement battery to be fitted by a qualified engineer.

Low Battery Warning


A low battery warning will appear on-screen when the battery is nearly exhausted. Please connect the supplied mains adaptor at this time to either continue using the player and/or recharge the battery.

Caution:

Danger of explosion if battery is incorrectly replaced.

REMOTE CONTROL

This section describes the remote control functions.



REMOTE CONTROL (CONTD.)

1. MUTE

Disable the audio output, applies to DVD player speakers, earphones and audio out

2. SOURCE

Press to select media source: DVD / MEDIA.

3 NUMBER BUTTONS

Used to select numbered items within menus and also to input password.

4. DISPLAY

Press to display playback information, i.e. disk chapter etc.

MENU

DVD: Press to return to the disk root menu

AUDIO

DVD: Press to toggle through available languages on current disk. CD: Press to toggle through available audio channels on current disk.

7. PLAY/PAUSE

Press once during playback to pause, press again to resume playback.

8. STOP

Press once during playback to stop playback of DVD content, pressing the play/pause button will then resume playback from that point. Press twice to stop playback of DVD content, this will cancel resume function.

9 A-B

Repeat a segment. Press once to set the start point, press again to set the endpoint. Press a third time to exit.

10. VOLUME

Press + or - as required to adjust volume level, applies to DVD player speakers and earphones.

11. NEXT / PREVIOUS

Press next or previous as required to move to next or previous chapter or track.

REMOTE CONTROL (CONTD.)

12. FAST FORWARD / REWIND

Press as required to move forwards or backwards (x2, x4, x8, x16, x32) during playback, pressing a sixth time will return to normal playback. Pressing the play button will also to return to normal playback.

13. ZOOM

DVD: Press zoom as required to enlarge or shorten the image. Each press changes zoom level: 2X, 3X, 4X, 1/2, 1/3, 1/4.

Normal

The zoom icon will appear on-screen briefly in the top right corner.

JPEG: Press zoom and then use the ▶▶ button to enlarge the image or

to ◀◀ shorten the image.
The navigation buttons can be used to toggle throughout the

enlarged image.
Press zoom once more to exit zoom mode.

14 PROGRAM

Press to open the program function, this enables you to select chapters or tracks.

Using the number buttons to select required chapters or tracks, press play to start playback.

To cancel stored program press the program button once more. Program will be cancelled when disc is removed or the DVD player is turned off

15. SLOW

Press as required to slow playback 1/2, 1/4,1/8, 1/16), pressing a fifth time will return to normal playback.

16 REPEAT

Press during playback to select required repeat mode as given below.

DVD: Chapter / Title / All /Off

CD: Track / All / Off

MP3: Shuffle / Random / Single / Repeat one / Repeat Folder / Off

17. SETUP

Press to open the Setup menu.

18 FNTFR

Press to confirm selection within the menus.

19. NAVIGATION BUTTONS

Press as required to navigate through the options within the menus.

REMOTE CONTROL (CONTD.)

20. TITLE

Press to return to the DVD title menu.

21 ANGLE

Press to change the viewing angle during DVD playback. This feature may not be available on some discs.

22. SUBTITLE

Press to toggle through available subtitle languages on current disk.

23. STEP

Press to view movie frame by frame.

24. SEARCH

Press to enter a specific time, title or chapter on current disk.

USING THE REMOTE CONTROL

The remote control is supplied with the battery installed, to start using please remove the plastic battery isolation tab.


When using the remote control, ensure that the remote is pointing towards the receiver on the front of the DVD player, as shown below.



Approximate working distance is 3 metres with a working angle of 30° left and right from centre.

To replace the battery please follow given instructions and see diagram below.

- 1. Push the spring clip to the right and slide battery tray out.
- Replace the battery with correct type (CR2025 3V) taking care that the polarity is correct, as shown below.



WARNING:

The remote control supplied with this product contains a coin/button cell battery.

- Do not ingest the battery, due to Chemical Burn Hazard.
- Keep new and used batteries away from children.
- If the battery compartment does not close securely, stop using the product and keep it away from children.
- If the coin/button cell battery is swallowed, it can cause severe internal burns in just 2 hours and can lead to death.
- If you think batteries might have been swallowed or placed inside any part of the body, seek immediate medical attention.

USB MEDIA PLAYBACK

The VOYAGER series of DVD players allows playback of media from a USB memory stick.



Insert the memory stick into the USB port located on the right-hand side of the DVD player, press the SOURCE button on the side of the DVD player or on the remote control and select Media.

The folders / files stored on the memory stick will be listed on screen, this may take a few seconds depending on how much content is stored on the memory stick.

Use the navigation and ENTER buttons to open folders and select files as required.

Movie Playback

Once a compatible video file (MPEG-2, DivX4/5, AVI, Xvid, Jpg, MP3) has been selected playback will begin.

Should the file be of a format that is not supported (e.g. MPEG-4) an on screen message will appear saying 'CODEC NOT SUPPORTED'.

In order to convert movies in to a playable format, see the section of this manual entitled "Video Compression Formats".

During playback, functions such as play / pause, fast forward, repeat, zoom etc. remain available.

Once playback is stopped press ◀ to return to previous directory.

Music Playback

Once selected a music file (Mp3) will begin playback.

During playback use the play / pause buttons on the remote control or on the side of the DVD player as required.

Fast forward and rewind can selected using the remote control.

Press ◀ to return to previous directory.

USB MEDIA PLAYBACK (CONTD.)

Viewing Images

Once an image has been selected a slide show will begin of the images available within the selected directory.

Press the stop button during the slide show to open the preview screen, from here you can access the 'Menu' to view button functions available during slide show.

To continue select 'Slide Show' and press ENTER, alternatively select an image to start the slide show.

The slide show will automatically stop once images within the selected directory have been viewed.

VIDEO COMPRESSION FORMATS

Video Compression Formats

The use of the DivX encoder is recommended in order to compress movies and then play upon this player. Whilst there are many movie formats and compression software available, most use MPEG4 algorithms at their heart. DivX is just one such MPEG4 compressor, but it is the most widely used and recognised by Sony, Panasonic and other manufacturers.

This device is capable of DivX playback in order to provide a reliable and consistent playback performance.


When using the official DivX encoder (download from www.DivX.com at a small charge) and always use the "Home Theatre" option for optimum compression and suitable playback quality upon the player. Maintain the 16:9 ratio for full screen viewing.

If your DivX movie is still unable to be played upon the Voyager Player then please change the file extension from .divx to .avi and re-try.

Use of other compression software, or the playback of other format files may have unreliable or unpredictable results and is not recommended.

SYSTEM SETUP MENU

Press SETUP on the remote control to access the system setup menus. Using the navigation buttons and enter button, select required option, press SETUP to exit.



TV DISPLAY

Select the aspect ratio of the playback image.

Default: 16:9

ANGLE MARK

Select the angle during playback.

Default: ON

OSD LANGUAGE

Select preferred language used for the DVD players on screen display.

Default: ENG

CLOSED CAPTION

Select whether to display the additional data that some discs contain during playback.

Default: ON

SCREEN SAVER

Turn Off / On the screen saver which appears on screen after a few minutes of inactivity.

Default: ON

LAST MEMORY

Turn Off / On the last memory function.

Default: ON

AUTO STANDBY


Turn Off / On the auto standby function.

Default: 3 H



PARFNTAL

Select the required parental control level to prevent minors from viewing unsuitable content.


The default setting is ADULT which allows all content. To change this setting, select required option and enter password (see Password Setup information on next page). Once the 4 digit password has been selected successfully OK will change to yellow, press ENTER to return to the preference menu. The selected parental control will be highlighted.

DFFAULT

Select RESET and press ENTER to return DVD player to default settings. This will not reset parental control or password had these previously be changed.

SMASHED SCREEN IDENTIFICATION

A Liquid Crystal Display (LCD) Screen is a multilayer complex component.


Under the tough outer plastic layer, the glass sandwich beneath holds the LCD crystals in place, which are themselves suspended in fluid. In the unfortunate event of an accident, particularly a sharp localized impact, the glass will break. The tough plastic outer sheet on the surface of the glass keeps all the glass intact underneath preventing shards from falling out. This is a specific safety feature, particularly implemented for the younger users and also for in-car use.

The broken glass normally shows signs of the impact mark and also cracks radiating away. The resultant fluid leakage renders the panel inoperable.

Symptoms are often a dark round mark, a white screen without picture and maybe some multi-coloured lines. Depending on the individual break, an element of the image may remain for a while, but not for long, as the fluid leaks away. Some inky black staining may also appear upon the crack lines, as the fluid escapes.

Unfortunately a break of this nature is not covered under the manufacturers warranty as it is accidental damage to the product, rather than an original defect from manufacture.

Please see below for a sample image of a broken LCD panel for reference. Replacement panels can however be installed by the VOYAGER product support centre after contacting them directly. See www.voyager-systems.co.uk for details.



PIXEL STATEMENT

The LCD screen contains 1,152,000 pixels. Pixels can however fail during normal product life. 1 pixel = 0.00000086% failure rate, one pixel failure per year of operation is considered normal and not a cause for concern.

TROUBLE SHOOTING

Problem	Solution
DVD player will not work.	Apply power to the DVD player by using the supplied mains adaptor, identified by the 'VOYAGER VYCDVD SERIES' sticker.
	Check DVD player On / Off switch is in the On position. Check the power LED indicator is illuminated on the DVD player, if not then the supplied mains adaptor or DC IN socket may have been damaged, please contact your local VOYAGER dealer for further information.
The DVD player has a blank screen and will not operate, even though switch is in the ON position.	The battery may be exhausted, apply power to the DVD player by using the supplied mains adaptor, identified by the 'VOYAGER VYCDVD SERIES' sticker.
	The DVD player may be in Auto-Standby shutdown. Using the ON / OFF switch turn off and on, normal operation should be available. The Auto-Shutdown function can be turned off in the setup menu
The disc will not play.	The disc may be damaged or dirty, clean the disc and try once more. If the disc will still not play try another. Poor playback may be caused by dirt on the laser lens, use a clean, dry cotton bud (add pure alcohol sparingly if available) and wipe the cotton bud across the lens VERY gently, the lens is held by spring suspension, so be very careful.
The picture is pixelated or distorted.	The disc may be damaged or dirty, clean the disc and try once more. If the disc will still not play try another.
No picture.	Check that the disk cover is closed firmly. Check the smashed screen identification information. Check the DVD player is in DVD mode.
Lines on the screen.	Check the smashed screen identification page. Any permanent diagonal lines are indication of breakage. The screen glass does NOT fall out, as this is a safety feature.
The loon appears on screen.	The requested operation is not allowed at this time.
Can't advance through a movie.	You can't advance through the opening credits and copyright warnings at the beginning of a movie as the disk is programmed to prevent this.
No sound or distorted sound.	Turn the volume UP on the remote control. Ensure that the MUTE key has not been pressed. Advance the movie to a section where sound should be heard. Press the AUDIO button on the remote control to choose an alternative.

TROUBLE SHOOTING (CONTD.)

Problem	Solution
No sound from the speakers.	Check the player by using headphones. If these are working normally then the headphone connector is damaged and needs repairing.
My headphones don't work correctly in the Headphone socket.	Check that the headphones are NOT multimedia headphones with an integrated microphone, as these will not work correctly. The Jack plug should have 3 silver contacts only, NOT 4.
USB media will not play.	Video, Music and Photo's may not be of the correct format. Ensure that any video recording is an official DivX type. (See earlier in manual) Music, MP3 and Photo JPEG formats. Use only USB sticks plugged directly to the USB socket and formatted in FAT 32. Check media device is not damaged. Change files with a '.divx' extension to '.avi'.
Disk cover flap is broken off.	Contact a VOYAGER approved service centre for a non-warranty repair.
The screen hinge is damaged.	Contact a VOYAGER approved service centre for a non-warranty repair.
The Multi-Functional button will not operate fast forward or rewind during movie playback.	This is normal, use the remote control.
The remote is not working.	Make the battery isolation tab has been removed. Make sure the DVD player is turned on. Ensure the remote control battery is working. Ensure to point the remote control directly at the DVD players IR receiver. Replace the battery with a new CR2025 type if required. Ensure disk is present within the DVD player. Ensure the disk is label uppermost.
'NO DISC' is shown on screen.	Ensure the disk is not distorted, stained, scratched or damaged.
